Call for Proposals to Host

APSIPA ASC 2014 and future

The Asia-Pacific Signal and Information Processing Association (APSIPA) is a new organization established in the autumn of 2009. For the detailed information, please see < <http://www.apsipa.org/> >. APSIPA is an emerging association to promote broad spectrum of research and education activities in signal and information processing. The interest of APSIPA encompasses but not limited signal and information processing, recognition, classification, communication, networking, computing, system design and implementation, security, and technology with applications to scientific, engineering, health, and social areas.

Past APSIPA Annual Summit and Conferences (ASC) were held in:

1. APSIPA ASC 2009, Sapporo, Hokkaido, Japan, October 5-7, 2009.
2. APSIPA ASC 2010, Singapore, December 14-17, 2010.
3. APSIPA ASC 2011, Xi'an, China, October 18-21, 2011.

The following APSIPA ASCs are scheduled:

4. APSIPA ASC 2012, Los Angeles, California, USA, December 3-6, 2012.
5. APSIPA ASC 2013, Kaohsiung, Taiwan, October 29-November 1, 2013.

APSIPA would like to ask all active teams for proposals to host ASC 2014 and future. These events should preferably be held during the fall season. The ASC are expected to attract 300 – 500 attendees. A significant number of them will be coming from outside the organizing country. The organizing team is expected to interact and coordinate closely with various APSIPA subcommittees to ensure topic coverage, technical quality, and outreach scope for the ASC.

Proposals should be submitted electronically to the APSIPA VP of Conferences, Prof. Yoshikazu Miyanaga (miya@ist.hokudai.ac.jp) by email with the following information, **before June 1, 2012**:

- (1) ASC international organizing committee: at least the General Chair and the Technical Program Chair should be assigned, although a tentative list of all the committee members is recommended.
- (2) ASC venue: provide brief descriptions of venue and transportation, and an area guide.
- (3) ASC timeline: dates and all deadlines.
- (4) ASC budget: as a new organization, APSIPA can provide only very limited financial support to the ASC organizer. Therefore, the organizing team is encouraged to seek funds from the industry and other institutions.
