APSIPA is a non-profit organization covering research of all aspects of signals and information, including processing, recognition, classification, communications, networking, computing, system design, security, implementation, and technology with applications to scientific, engineering, health, and social areas. Past APSIPA ASC conferences were held in Hokkaido, Japan (2009), Singapore (2010), Xi'an, China (2011), Los Angeles, USA (2012), Kaohsiung, Taiwan (2013) and Siem Reap, Cambodia (2014). In addition, incoming APSIPA ASCs currently on schedule will be held in Hong Kong (2015), Seoul, South Korea (2016), and Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (2017). To promote technical objectives of the Association, currently APSIPA has 6 technical committees:

Signal Processing Systems: Design and Implementation (SPS)

Signal and Information Processing Theory and Methods (SIPTM)

Speech, Language and Audio (SLA)

Biomedical Signal Processing and Systems (BioSiPS)

Image, Video and Multimedia (IVM)

Wireless Communications and Networking (WCN)

Proposals should be submitted electronically to the APSIPA VP of Conferences, Professor Susanto Rahardja (susantorahardja@gmail.com) by email with the following information, before June 1, 2015:

1. International organizing committee: at least the General Chair(s) and the Technical Program Chair(s) should be assigned, although a tentative list of all the committee members is recommended.
2. Venue: provide brief descriptions of venue and transportation, and an area guide.
3. Timeline: dates and all deadlines.
4. Budget: as a new organization, APSIPA can provide only very limited financial support to the ASC organizer. Therefore, the organizing team is encouraged to seek funds from the industry and other institutions.

Proposals will be reviewed by the APSIPA Conference Committee. Accepted proposals will be invited to present at APSIPA ASC 2015 in Hong Kong, www.apsipa2015.org.
